(PROHIBITION OF DRIVING)

TEMPORARY ORDER 2020

T1182T

To allow telecoms ducting and cabling works to be carried out, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on sections of Broad Street and School Lane, Ramsgate.

Closures are planned from Monday 18 May 2020, with completion currently expected by 22 May 2020.

School Lane will be closed off-peak during the day and Broad Street will be closed overnight, as detailed below.

BROAD STREET – *overnight closures* for 5 nights, from 18:00 hours through until approximately 02:00 hours each night
Closures will be in 2 phases, as signposted on site.

PHASE 1 – Broad Street closed from a point north-west of the taxi-rank north-westwards to the junction with Hardres Street

The alternative route for through traffic is via King Street, Brunswick Street and Hardres Street

The One-way Traffic Orders in respect of the following roads will be suspended to the extent defined:

- Hardres Street between Brunswick Street and Broad Street
- Broad Street between King Street and the taxi-rank
- King Street between Brunswick Street and Broad Street

Waiting and loading will be prohibited on both sides of Hardres Street between the junctions with Brunswick Street and Broad Street between 17:00 hours through until approximately 06:00 hours on any night that the one-way is suspended and appropriate signage is displayed on site.

PHASE 2 – Broad Street closed between the junctions with Hardres Street and School Lane

The alternative routes for through traffic are

***Westbound* via Hardres Street, A255 Boundary Road and Church Road**

***Eastbound* via Church Hill, High Street and Hardres Street**

SCHOOL LANE – *off-peak closures* for 5 days between 09:30 hours and approximately 15:30 hours each day

School Lane closed between the junctions with Broad Street and Brunswick Street in 2 phases to the extent indicated on site

The alternative routes for through traffic are

***Southbound* via Belmont Street, Hardres Street, Sussex Street, King Street and Broad Street**

***Northbound* via Broad Street, Hardres Street and Belmont Street**
