A299 HENGIST WAY, RAMSGATE

(40 MPH SPEED LIMIT)

TEMPORARY ORDER 2021

For the safety of the public and workforce during construction works for the new Thanet Parkway Railway Station, Kent County Council has made an Order to impose a temporary mandatory speed limit of 40 mph on part of A299 Hengist Way, Cliffsend, near Ramsgate.

A compulsory 40 mph speed limit will be imposed in both directions on A299 Hengist Way, from a point 115 metres east of Sevenscore Roundabout extending eastwards to the existing 40 mph / 50 mph speed limit signs approximately 205 metres south-west of Lord of the Manor Roundabout.

The Speed Limit applies as and when, and to the actual extent clearly indicated by relevant signs displayed on site, and applies at all times.

This comes into force from Monday 15 March 2021 and remains in force until the works have been completed, with estimated completion by 2 July 2021.

The planned dates and duration may change for various reasons including adverse weather conditions and the current coronavirus situation, and updated information can be found on www.one.network – [Kent County Council Permit GE710TPWSWN01], with any changes signposted on site and notified locally.
