**KENT COUNTY COUNCIL**  
**KING STREET, RAMSGATE**  
**(PROHIBITION OF DRIVING)**  
**TEMPORARY ORDER AUGUST 2020**

To allow works to be carried out to provide a new water connection, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of King Street, Ramsgate.

A closure is currently planned from Monday 24 August 2020, with estimated completion by 26 August.

King Street will be closed in the general vicinity of number 34A, with no through access between the junctions with Brunswick Street and Broad Street.

The alternative route for through traffic is via Brunswick Street, Turner Street and Broad Street.

The One-way Traffic Order in respect of King Street will be suspended between the junctions with Brunswick Street and Broad Street, to allow essential access / exit up to where the road is closed.

The One-way Traffic Order in respect of Broad Street will be suspended between the junctions with Turner Street and King Street to allow its use for the diversion.

Due to the nature of the works, the restrictions will need to remain in force at all times.
