THANET SURFACE TREATMENTS 2021

(TRAFFIC RESTRICTIONS)

TEMPORARY ORDER 2021

To allow a programme of carriageway patching and surface treatment works to be carried out, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily restrict traffic on various roads throughout the Thanet District.

This is part of a county-wide programme which involves a number of stages of works for each road

- Patching & repairs
- Laying the Surface Treatment
- Finally works to reinstate road markings and adjust iron-works (road drain covers, manhole covers, etc.) to suit the new surface.

Each of the stages may require a road closure, so there may be up to 4 separate sets of closures for any road at various times.

Many locations involve the imposition of temporary compulsory speed limits.

The dates of works have yet to be finalised at this stage. Once the works have been programmed, the dates will be publicised beforehand, sign-posted on site and notified to local residents.

Works will generally be within the times 07:00 hours and 19:00 hours each day, but certain works may need to be carried out outside these times where there is a specific need.

ROAD CLOSURES

Road closures will be to the actual extent indicated by appropriate signage and barriers on site.

Access for any residents and businesses affected will be maintained when it is safe to do so, especially for those roads

which are *cul-de-sacs*; however, there are likely to be delays and certain times when this is not possible for safety reasons.

SPEED LIMITS

Temporary mandatory speed limits may need to be imposed on certain roads for the reasons defined below.

Where compulsory speed limits do need to be imposed, they will apply in both directions and will be clearly indicated by relevant signage displayed on site.

- After Surface Treatment works, a speed limit of 20 mph may need to be imposed on certain roads for a period of up to 7 days.
- Where works are being carried out without the need for road closures, a 20 mph speed limit may need to be imposed through active works for safety reasons
- An additional 40 mph speed limit may need to be imposed for up to 300 metres either side of the 20 mph speed limits, to create a safe zone.
- The 20 mph and 40 mph speed limits apply during active works and for up to 7 days afterwards.

This Order comes into force from Monday 8 March 2021 and remains in force until the works have been completed, for a maximum of 18 months.

These works are subject to weather and other factors which may potentially cause changes at short notice; every effort will be made to keep as close as possible to the planned dates that are notified, and any changes will be publicised.

SCHEDULE

Through traffic will be prohibited on the following roads to the extent defined, listed in alphabetical order of town or village.

20-mph speed limits may need to be imposed on some of these roads as and when indicated, to the same maximum extent as the closures.

THE STREET, ACOL, BIRCHINGTON – closure between Acol Hill and Minster Road

Alternative route via B2190 Minster Road, Spitfire Way, B2050 Manston Road and Acol Hill

KING STREET & DANE ROAD, MARGATE – closure between Trinity Square and Wilderness Hill
Alternative route via Trinity Square, Northdown Road and Wilderness Hill

WILDERNESS HILL, MARGATE – closure between Dane Road and Northdown Road
Alternative route via Dane Road, Approach Road, Cliftonville Avenue and Northdown Road

MARSH FARM ROAD, MINSTER – closure from Watchester Lane
There is no alternative route

PEGWELL ROAD, RAMSGATE – closure between Downs Road and Goodwin Road
Alternative route via Downs Road and Goodwin Road

WILFRED ROAD, RAMSGATE – closure between Park Road and Station Approach Road
Alternative route via A255 Park Road, Shah Place and Station Approach Road

THE STREET, ST NICHOLAS AT WADE – closure between A28 Canterbury Road and Court Road
Alternative route via A28 Canterbury Road, Potten Street Road and Court Road

ST MILDRED'S ROAD, WESTGATE-ON-SEA – closure between A28 Canterbury Road and Cuthbert Road
Alternative route via Westgate Bay Avenue, Westbrook Avenue, Bridge Road and A28 Canterbury Road

MINSTER ROAD, WESTGATE-ON-SEA – closure between A28 Canterbury Road and Shottendane Road
Alternative route via A28 Canterbury Road, George V Avenue, Hartsdown Road, Shottendane Road

SPEED LIMITS

Temporary mandatory 20 mph and 40 mph speed limits will be imposed on the following roads which are not subject to closures, during and after works, to the actual extent indicated on site.

MANSTON ROAD, MARGATE – speed restrictions between Shottendane Road and the Waste Recycling Centre

MONTEFIORE AVENUE, RAMSGATE – speed restrictions to be in force between Hereson Road and Dumpton Park Drive
