**VARIOUS ROADS, RAMSGATE &
BROADSTAIRS - SEWER UPGRADE**

(PROHIBITION OF DRIVING)

TEMPORARY ORDER 2019

To allow works to be carried out as part of an ongoing programme to replace Thanet's ageing sewers, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on various roads in Ramsgate and Broadstairs.

The roads affected are as defined below, listed in alphabetical order.

Closures are currently in place on each of the roads, and the current estimated duration of closure and alternative routes are as follows.

Due to the nature of the works, all restrictions will need to remain in force at all times.

AUGUSTA ROAD, RAMSGATE – closed in the vicinity of number 6

Closure in force until 31 August 2019

The alternative route is via Victoria Parade, Victoria Road, Bellevue Road

CANNONBURY ROAD, RAMSGATE – closed in the general vicinity of the junction with Florence Road

Closure in force until 31 August 2019

The alternative route is via Grange Road, Westcliff Road and Cannonbury Road

LORNE ROAD, RAMSGATE – closures in the vicinity of junction with Bloomsbury Road

Closure in force until 9 August 2019

The alternative route is via Mays Road, Grange Road, Southwood Road

**ROSEMARY AVENUE, BROADSTAIRS – closed south of the junction
Brassey Avenue, as indicated
Closure in force until 30 July 2019
The alternative route is via Brassey Avenue and Salisbury Avenue**

**WILLSONS ROAD, RAMSGATE – closed in the general vicinity of
number 18
Closure in force until 21 August 2019
The alternative route is via Vale Road and Grange Road**

**All closures are clearly indicated by signs and barriers on site, and
local access to the remainder of each road is being maintained
wherever possible.**

weather and other factors that may potentially cause changes at short
notice; every effort will be made to keep as close as possible to the
planned dates shown above, and any changes will be notified locally
and signposted on site.**
